One of the things that I appreciate about our house are the trees that surround our property. Aside from the shade they provide, I enjoy the sounds of life they bring to our yard; from the rustle of wind moving through the branches to the many birds and squirrels that call those trees their home. When we submitted our purchase offer, the trees still had their leaves but by the time we moved in a month later they were gone. Our yard was quiet during the colder months, but as Spring approached we began to see signs of life returning to the space as everything turned yellow from pollen. Yuck, but no biggie, I just rinsed off the cars and swept the deck...and sneezed...a lot. Recently, as the trees have leafed and life has come back to our yard in a big way I came face to face with a reality of growth...sap. I've never seen so much sap! I come out to the car in the morning to take Eli to school and my car looks like it just left a rainstorm, huge droplets of sap everywhere!

A couple of Saturdays ago I thought that maybe we were through the worst of it. I got out my buckets and soap and spent hours washing away months of dust and dirt from our travels and layers and layers of pollen from our cars. I went to sleep that night tired, but feeling great at how the cars looked and how much I enjoyed some time with my thoughts as I washed and dried and polished. Well, as you've no doubt guessed, I came out the next morning and the cars I had worked so hard on were once again absolutely covered in sap and now had the addition of some kind of flower pods.

I ran my car through a quick car wash up at the gas station in Lewisville last week as I was thinking about Sunday's Scripture passage (John 15.1-8). In the passage, Jesus is speaking to the disciples about grapevines before being given over to the authorities and beginning his journey towards the crucifixion. Specifically, he says, "Every branch that bears fruit [God] prunes to make it bear more fruit." (John 15.2b). While these words have been misused to paint a picture of a God who uses illness, loss, and hurt to somehow make us better disciples (a theological view I cannot get behind!). I did have a moment of connection as I watched the soap suds roll down my windshield. While the deluge of sap was frustrating for me, it was a sign of growth for the trees that I appreciate so much in our yard. Because the trees were coming back to life following their winter nap; because they were experiencing growth and were healthy, the sap was flowing. This reminded me that growth isn't always a pleasant experience for us, but growth is necessary for our ongoing well-being. I think this is what Jesus was alluding to as he spoke to the disciples that evening.

The Holy Spirit was sent to us as a guide and helper as we seek to become clearer reflections of God's grace and mercy in this world. As we grow in our faith, learning to trust the leadings and direction of the Holy Spirit, we come face to face with the areas of our lives that need change/growth, which may be discomforting and make us uneasy. For instance, we may be shown a prejudice or bias we learned early in life and never noticed before, but now we understand the harm it has caused in this world. We may see, for the first time, people around us who are hurting or hungry and be drawn into their story by the Spirit. Not unlike the growth pains we experience during puberty, confronting our growing edges is not always comfortable or easy. But that unease and occasional discomfort, like my trees' sap, is a sign of life, a sign of growth. Don't be afraid to let the Holy Spirit in and the transformation begin. Growing and maturing in our faith, being nurtured by the Holy Spirit, brings the Kingdom of God to our here and now, one life at a time.
